The mission of the Texas Board of Nursing (BON) is to protect and promote the well-being of the people of Texas by ensuring that every person licensed as a nurse in the State of Texas is competent to practice safely. The Council fulfills its mission by regulating nursing practice and approving nursing education programmes. This mission, derived from the Nursing Practice Act, goes beyond the interest of any individual, the nursing profession, or any special interest group. Registered Nursing (RN) & Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) Examination Licensed Applicants must meet the following requirements: Complete the online application or the appropriate paper application for an RN or LPN. Submit an appropriate fee. Note: The fee is non-refundable. If you answer YES to any eligibility questions on the paper exam application, include a statement explaining the events of the accident (s). Include official court documents showing the disposition of the incident (s). Check criminal records. Submit an affidavit of graduation from your nursing school. If you are a graduate of an approved nursing school in Texas, the school will submit an online affidavit of degree directly to the BON. If you graduated outside the state, ask your school of nursing principal/principal to fill out the affidavit for RN or LPN and send it directly to the BON. You must pass the Texas Nursing Law Exam before you can be issued a Test Authorization (ATT) for the NCLEX® exam. Register with the testing agency before or immediately after submitting the license application to take the licence test. NCLEX (National Council Licensure Examination). To complete the registration you can use one of the following ways: Register online. The \$200 registration fee can be paid by American Express, Visa or MasterCard. Oklahoma by ensuring that anyone who practices or offers to practice Registered Nursing Practice, or Advanced Nursing Practice in this state is competent to do so. The Council shall also ensure that any person concerned; or undertakes to exercise as a person of advanced assistance without a licence in this State is competent to do so. The Council achieves this through the regulation of the nursing license, the certification of unauthorized assistance, nursing practice and nursing education. The purpose, as defined in Oklahoma Nursing NursingAct, replaces the interests of any individual, nursing profession or any special interest group. General Functions of the Oklahoma Infirma Council 1. Prescribe standards for educational programs that prepare people for license or certification as registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, or advanced licensed assistants. A. Provide surveys of nursing programs according to the Rules. B. Approval of nursing training programmes and advanced undergraduate and non-licensed training programmes that meet the prescribed standards. C. Refuse or revoke the approval of educational programs for failure to comply with or maintain the prescribed standards. 2. Release/renew the license of Advanced Practice Registered Nurses that meet the prescribed authority to registered nurses that meet approved standards. On 7.
